Transcripts

Students applying to post-secondary institutions within Nova Scotia do not require a transcript to be sent to the institution as long as they put their NS provincial ID# on their application.

Students applying to post-secondary institutions **outside of NS** will need to sign the binder on the table in Student services to request a transcript be sent to admissions.

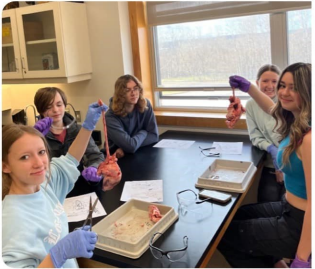
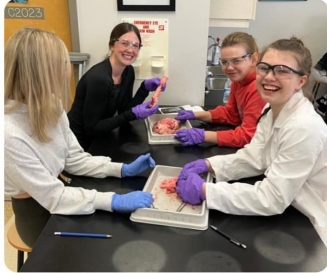

Grad Fee

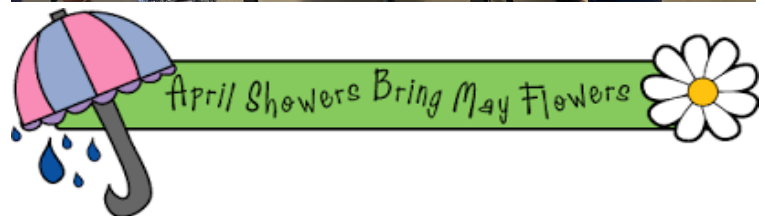
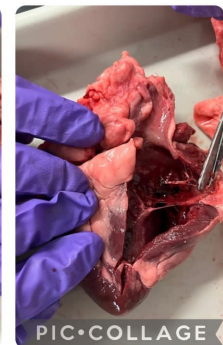
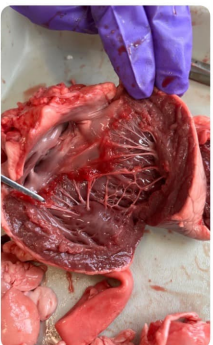
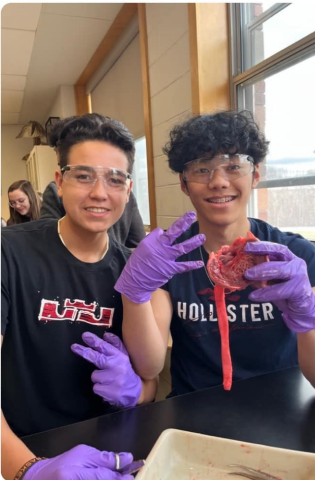
